*The root of Yizkor is zachar,  
"to remember"*

In the morning of October 5, and in the morning of October 17, many of you will read the special prayers from the Makhzorim, in memory of those who are no longer with us.

Yizkor calls upon us to remember our loved ones as they once appeared to us - the things they hoped for and that they feared, the things they celebrated and admonished, the things they learned & the things they taught, their feelings and values.

There are two parts to Yizkor: 1) A brief prayer for the departed and 2) A commitment to give charity (Tzedaka) on behalf of the deceased person's soul. In addition to a monetary donation, one can also commit to donate time to a charitable cause. The soul gains additional merit because they can no longer do mitzvos in this world.
